"Fiji is called the big brother of the South Pacific region, and in that spirit of brotherhood, Fiji is reaching out to children in other South Pacific Island nations who also need the same help as children in Fiji. There is something special about Fiji, may be its warmth, hospitality, niceties, kindness, and all allembracing culture. When you land in Fiji, the first thing you see in the airport is 'Welcome Home.' This culture is something that endears Fiji towards us and us towards the Fijians.

When we serve Fiji's children, we serve our children. They are not strangers to anyone. The kind of work that is happening in Fiji is a prototype for the rest of the world."





Sadguru's Vision for Fiji

Our next milestone is to ensure that we do more surgeries this year. The first year, you were testing the waters, trying to build teams and bring teams from around the world. We performed surgeries every alternate month and took another month to recover from the strain and stress. This year, we shall perform surgeries every month, with the help of our visiting teams. I hope that in a year or more, when we celebrate the second anniversary of the Hospital, we will be able to have a permanent team here, of surgeons and the entire medical team, so that this becomes a regular daily running hospital. That will be our vision in another two years.

We don't want to import doctors and nurses from all around the world. We want to train and develop Fijian medical professionals into competent surgeons and other medical professionals. We have to make Fiji self-sufficient in paediatric cardiac care. We should build an excellent team and make this a 'Centre of Excellence.'

The free medical college in India will help in selecting people from Fiji, and train them, give them internships, observerships, and other kinds of degrees that are required for them to practice paediatric cardiac skills or medicine in Fiji Island itself.

Screening Hearts Across the Sea Belt

ri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Children's Hospital in Fiji expanded its horizons and reached out to children in Kiribati, one of the island countries in the continent of Oceania, for a three-day heart screening camp at Tarawa, the capital city of Kiribati.

Ministry of Health of Kiribati brought the children from the surrounding islands to the main Tarawa Hospital, where the Sanjeevani team from Fiji screened children, who would have otherwise been left without a place to go to, for there are no facilities available for paediatric cardiac services at Kiribati.







Some of the defects found were Ventricular Septal Defects (VSD), Pulmonary Stenosis, Cyanotic Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF), Acyanotic Tetralogy of Fallot, and Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA).

Story of the Two Birds in muṇḍaka upaniṣad

The lower bird tasted bitter and sweet berries and felt sad or happy. This continued until one day it looked up and saw the upper bird sitting peacefully and equanimously without eating any berries, but just being a witness and enjoying itself. The lower bird started aspiring to be like the upper bird, and started hopping from one branch to the other to get close to the upper bird. Upon reaching there, it realised that there was no upper bird at the first place. There is only one – the witness or the supreme consciousness.

The thought that identifies one as the lower bird, makes one finite and limited. But when one realises that he is nothing but the upper bird, he gives up all pursuits, except the pursuit of truth and peace.

27 April 2023 – First Anniversary of Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Children's Hospital, Suva, Fiji

Many asked us as to why we were building a children's heart hospital when we did not have a well-established adult cardiac programme. But, how can we not help these innocent children born with a defect in their hearts for no fault of theirs? Can you imagine the plight of the parents who know there is treatment available in the world, yet they cannot access it because they cannot afford it?

Our dear Sadguru and members of Sai Prema Foundation Fiji realised that this is a very unfair proposition that has fallen upon the people of Fiji and the South Pacific Islands.

This hospital was created with the vision to alleviate the suffering of the children of Fiji and the Pacific, and ensure that no financial burden befalls their parents.

The hospital's vision is to emerge and become the most important paediatric cardiac care centre for Fiji and the South Pacific Islands.



25 Life-saving surgeries were conducted in 8 days

73 lives were saved by our visiting teams around the world before inauguration of the hospital.

As of 26 April 2023, 214 lives have been saved, and these are not just 214 lives. These are 214 family members, mothers, fathers, brothers, sisters, grandmothers, grandfathers, uncles, and aunties, who experience joy. This is the power of goodness. This is the power of humanity.

Six visiting teams came over to Fiji from United States, National University Hospital Singapore, Sanjeevani Hospital India, and the Heart4Kids team from Starship Hospital New Zealand.

The Sanjeevani team has performed almost 12,000 free echocardiograms in our children's heart screening centre and at over 20 public health facilities, hospitals, and health centres around Viti Levu island, at the towns of Labasa, Bua, and Savusavu in Vanua Levu island, Taveuni island and at Levuka in Ovalau island.

- **25 life-saving surgeries** were conducted in 8 days from 17 to 24 April 2023 by a visiting team from United States, Australia, India, Oman, and New Zealand.
- **9 children from Soloman Islands** and **4 children from Kiribati** had their heart surgeries done.





27 April 2023 – First Anniversary of Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Children's Hospital, Suva, Fiji

"We saw a whole variety of congenital heart defects. All of these children who have done their surgeries have done well.

One of the children who was six months old had trouble breathing and feeding. The comment from the mother on the first day made the team's day, when she said – 'this is the first time I see my baby breathe normally, and this is the first time I see my baby feed normally.'

It was nice to see several children playing soccer with the balloons in the ward on days two and three after the surgery."

The Sai Sanjeevani Hospital stands today because of the Sai Prema Foundation, a registered non-profit charitable organisation. This 25 million paediatric facility is a matter of great pride, as Fiji is the first country in the region to establish such a hospital. While it serves the children of Fiji, it has also opened its doors to children from across the Pacific. Before opening this hospital, there was no paediatric cardiac facility available in Fiji or in the Pacific, and a family would have had to pay more than 100,000 FJD for overseas treatment. I thank Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai for his vision to provide essential medical services absolutely free of cost to all without any discrimination.

Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai's Message

I am impressed by the Fiji Prime Minister's vision for his Government when he said – 'Let Love Shine.' He told his people that love should be the way for the country of Fiji, so they can progress in unity and peace.

When a child smiles after a successful surgery, it is love that shines through his/her smile. Sai Ananda Educare Centre completed one year of its operations this March 2023, and it was celebrated with a grand Graduation and Awards Ceremony.

The event was attended by children, teachers, parents, and members of Sai Ananda.

Veda chanting, Quran recital, story-telling, musical play, yoga...etc. were performed by the students.



Sai Ananda Educare Centre came into being when the world was facing the aftermaths of the COVID pandemic, and to recompense the situation in the sector of education by providing completely free of cost values-based education to children.

It started functioning from February 2022 to provide education to underprivileged and refugee children in and around the vicinity of Sai Ananda Foundation, Malaysia.

10 little children found their way to the centre in 2022 and today the number has grown to 150 children.

10 teachers are serving at the centre currently.

Sai Ananda Refugee Education Centre, Sai Ananda Kindergarten, and Sai Ananda Tutorial Centre are the three divisions of the educare centre catering to children of different ages and different needs.

The students of the schools were also involved in the activity of packaging. The packed groceries were distributed to beneficiaries at the school.

- MOUs with Tata Steel Foundation
- 1. MOU was signed between Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital, Jamshedpur, and Tata Steel Foundation (TSF). TSF approached Sai Sanjeevani, Jamshedpur to provide quality secondary and tertiary maternal and child healthcare services, totally free of cost, for Jharkhand's rural and tribal expecting women referred by TSF's MANSI (Maternal and Newborn Survival Initiative) programme.

The MANSI programme works on the mode of a public-private partnership that focuses on building the capacity of existing government voluntary health workers (Accredited Social Health Activists or ASHA workers, known as Sahiyyas in Jharkhand). Sahiyyas are provided with training on various parameters that will address the root causes for neonate and infant mortality.

iversity of seeds in cereals, millets, vegetables and fruits was the topic discussed at the two-day district level Organic Farming Skill Enhancement Programme and Exhibition that was organised by the Prashanthi Balamandira Trust in collaboration with the Department of Agriculture, Chikkaballapur, Karnataka.

The programme was inaugurated by Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai at the grounds of Hrudaya Mandira in Sathya Sai Grama.

Sadguru interacted with all the farmers who had put up their stalls, and listened to them to understand their displays in the exhibition. Many of these farmers had come from the districts of Kolar and Chikkaballapur.

Some of the displays were:

More than 200 kinds of paddy seeds of Karnataka



- Diverse seeds of vegetables like brinjal, chilly, spinach
- Diverse seeds of fruits like jackfruit, mango...etc.
- Organic fertilisers that enrich microbial content of the soil
- Ancient farming equipments

A seed bank will be established at Sathya Sai Grama to help farmers procure various types of seeds and conserve them.

Participants came from the University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore, University of Horticultural Sciences, Bagalkot, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, ICAR, and the Indian Institute of Horticultural Research, Bengaluru.

Alongside the exhibition, a training programme was also conducted. Farmers interacted with various progressive organic farmers.

Dr Andrew Taylor Still is the Founder of Osteopathy. Although Osteopathy is a young profession, it will immensely benefit infants and newborns. 10-25% of Osteopathic patients are children, and female to male ratio stands at 60:40.

Dr Accorsi Alessandro, Department of Paediatric Cardiac Surgery and Cardiology, University Hospitals Ancona, Italy

Research on Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment (OMT) has given important lessons and several case studies. OMT results in reduction of length of stay and reduction of costs in preterm infants. "My son was treated successfully through a timely intervention of Osteopathy."

Dr Rahul Jain, Assistant Professor of Cardiorespiratory, Government Physiotherapy College, Raipur

It is important for students to learn newer things. Salient basic features of Physiotherapy was explained. Apgar score, sleep cycles, weight, duration of surgery in case of infants/ babies, ICU assessment, etc. were elaborated.

Dr Vandana Patel, Assistant Professor (Rehabilitation), Government Physiotherapy College, Raipur

Physiotherapy is a multi-disciplinary approach aimed towards quick recovery and early discharge of post-surgery patients. "Sometimes, the real superheroes live in the hearts of the small children fighting big battles."

ruike Specialty Hospital (ASH) runs two clinical facilities in remote rural areas ✓ ✓ in the States of Enugu and Imo. These hospitals provide quality free healthcare services to rural dwellers. Both the hospitals offer a wide range of paediatric and maternal healthcare services, while also treating children and adults from all age groups. In the month of March 2023, the following services were provided:

- Outpatient consultations were conducted for 387 children and 668 adults
- 158 patients got their Ophthalmic treatment
- 24 deliveries were performed, which included 2 caesarean sections
- **169 expecting women** were given the necessary antenatal care



- 28 children were given immunisation
- **18 surgeries** were performed, which included surgeries like circumcision, catheterisation, appendectomy, manual vacuum aspiration, cervical tear repair, and herniorrhaphy
- **1,242 investigations** were conducted
- **123 patients** were admitted in the hospitals as inpatients

Educare

- 1,166 students of TELA wrote their End Term examinations
- 300 students who enrolled themselves to learn cricket received their theory lessons on the game of cricket
- International Women's Day was celebrated by TELA teachers by raising awareness about discrimination and the necessity to take action against gender inequality

On 18 March 2023, a few students and staff of Spiritan Self-Awareness Initiative visited Nigerian Correctional Service (a government agency which operates prisons in Nigeria) at Enugu, to commemorate the birthday of their Founder, Late Father Charles Ogada. The students and staff distributed toiletries, detergents...etc. to those in confinement and spent some quality time by doing prayers with them.

- In March 2023, the Greek volunteers cooked 821 hot meals, which included peas cooked in olive oil, cheese and spinach pies, pasta, and lentil soup. About 1,209 vegetarian sandwiches and salads were also prepared by them. These were delivered to 'The Good Shepherd', 'Tsougraneion' Soup Kitchen of the Greek Orthodox Church, and to the social kitchen 'O Allos Anthropos'
- **50 boxes** comprising of several food items (pasta, lentils, beans, oil, tomato sauce, rice, chickpeas, etc.) equivalent to preparing 4,250 portions were delivered to St Theodore Church in Anavyssos



- 80 boxes of different food items, such as legumes, pasta, rice, milk, oil, cereals, and snacks, along with daily essentials like soap, washing powder, etc. were distributed to needy families, at the Anavyssos area, in the South of Athens. The food items in a box can approximately cook 1,840 meals
- 1,200 portions of yogurt, 720 litres of milk, and 40 kgs of feta cheese, were donated to both the Old People's Homes of Athens and Palea Fokea
- 70 pizzas were offered to the children and adults with disabilities of EGNYA Foundation
- 35 pizzas were delivered to the children of St. Andrew Children's Home

In the month of March 2023, the volunteers continued to do their regular service activities.

- About 77 animals at several districts in Istanbul were provided with food, water, and in some cases, the necessary medical care
- **1,660 meals** consisting of cooked legumes alongside milk and yogurt were distributed door to door at Sisli, Pendik, Ömerli, and other districts of Istanbul
- 6,000 kgs of charcoal and 6,000 kgs of wood were distributed to 20 families at several districts of Istanbul for heating purposes
- 229,000 meals were distributed at Adıyaman Besni, one of the cities affected by the earthquake



Ukraine

- In the month of March 2023, the volunteers of Heart of Heart distributed on an average,
 60 parcels with food, hygiene products, and medicines to needy individuals
- 200 packets containing hygiene products, stationery for children, diapers for disabled children and infants were distributed to displaced families whose houses were destroyed in the eastern and southern regions
- 10 elderly people who lived in a hostel at Kherson due to de-occupation of the city, were given food parcels once a week
- **400 people** were fed with **hot breakfast** at Kyiv. Bananas were also distributed to many elderly and homeless at Kyiv
- With the support of 'A Light for Ukraine',
 35 hygiene kits were delivered to Christian Humanitarian Hub at Kamianske in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast or province, where more than 1,000 refugee families with kids are staying



- 30 food baskets made by volunteers of Heart to Heart were distributed among displaced families
- A Light for Ukraine and Sai Prema Public Institution (Lithuania) helped the volunteers of Kharkiv deliver medicines, underwear, and socks to about 40 people at a hospital in Kharkiv
- **70 needy individuals** at Slobozhanske were given medicines and food by the volunteers of Kharkiv
- The volunteers bought a power generator for the surrounding villages like Muravlynka, Medvedovka, Lozovenka, Parascovia, Cossack, Aleksandrovka, and Antonov Kathe, to use when there is no power. They also helped the villagers monetarily to buy petrol in an emergency situation
- A young disabled woman from Ivankiv, Kyiv region who can hardly walk because of progressing arthritis was transported to the dentist to have her aching tooth cured

Easter signifies the supremacy and eternity of the soul over the temporal body and mortal existence.



All our services are free because 95% of our beneficiaries come from families who earn less than 150 USD a month, and are already burdened with several obligations. If education isn't given free to children from these families, their parents would never send them to a school or college, especially the girls whom they find as a big liability. Many of these children end up in a child labour scenario at mechanic shops or farms. So, unless it's free, there's no incentive for the parents to send their kids to school.

Charging a fee will be about doing injustice to everyone and injustice to our idea as a vision.

The need of the hour is to liberate education, especially medical education, from this triangulating world of commerce.

We are heralding a new world order where education is decommercialised, and health care is decommoditised.

Souping up Sustainability

We had nothing but a vision and an idea when we started. But, after 10 years, we have received support from like-minded people and philanthropists from 30+ countries.

Corporate Social Responsibility in India has helped us forge right partnerships to ensure efficient use of CSR funds.



We have partnered, collaborated, and co-created a common future for our rural children and rural people, and this is how we have sustained our services.

We are a 100 trillion-dollar world economy. We are the richest in our history. But the only need is to connect those who want to do something with those who need help.

We would have spent about 200 million US dollars in the last ten years on capital and operational expenditures.

God gives us more because he trusts us with his wealth, talents, knowledge, and abilities so that we can serve His children who are less capable or less able to take care of themselves.



People Vs Money - Where is the demand?

The greater need now is not money, but people. We want the right kind of people to run the organisations. Many schools are closing down in India because of lack of teachers. There are rural hospitals without a doctor, nurse, or paramedical staff.

Thus, the bigger need to make our services sustainable is to get our people to participate in our mission.

Almost 100 of our students from our University have joined us back as teachers and administrators, and 50 of them are girls. They are getting employment with us, by which they can help the next generation.

Another way to do this, is to help the institutions financially.





One Precondition and Several Perks

One condition is that our students must serve in our institutions for as many years as they have studied in our institutions. This gives us trained, competent, and compassionate resources, which make our systems very efficient.

These students who join us will be paid on par with salaries given by the Government and they shall be exposed to a wide spectrum of medical cases. While working in our hospitals, the students can also do their Postgraduate studies with us. The students can choose to have a lifelong association with us, apart from the preconditioned years of their service for us.



Happy Donors - More bang for the buck and the being

There are many volunteers who work for our organisation and this saves a lot of cost for us. Our own students join back our institutions and thus the cost of hiring new resources from outside is almost negligible.

Our administrative cost is less than 1%, and rest goes directly to the beneficiaries.

And over and above these, students trained in our system are tuned to the culture of compassion and service, and this ensures that our system works efficiently and quality of our service is always high.

Many people who are part of our system find spiritual solace and inspiration to do more for the society. This is a give and take transaction where everyone is benefitted.



An Economic Model that Furthers

While on one side, we are an economic model that cuts cost and gives it to the beneficiary; on the other side we are also a model that boosts the economy of the country by giving employment to rural youth and empowering them economically too, which in turn will come of help to their families.



The Need for an Integrated School of Medicine

We wanted to have an integrated school of medicine that allows for both allopathic and ayurvedic intervention. Ayurveda can be very helpful in preventing and recuperating health; at the same time, surgery is essential sometimes wherever it needs to be done.

Introducing Ayurveda, Naturopathy, Siddha and Yoga are important to broaden perspectives in children and help them get a broad understanding about medicine.

We are incorporating some electives into our existing curriculum through credit courses.

We are also working towards commencing a research center that will conduct real time evidence-based research on how Ayurveda, Naturopathy, or any other Indian school of medicine is effective. The findings will be published in reputed journals across the world.

We are working with Maharishi International University in USA, which has one of the most advanced genomic labs. These labs study the expression of genes and shows how these genes express themselves positively after a meditation, yoga or relaxation session.

Ethics are compromised when there is a financial gain, or a selfish gain that may not necessarily be monetary—it could be out of a sense of competition to get the next prize or to outdo your competitor. If we remove selfishness from the equation, ethics will naturally follow.

Maharishi Charaka, the Founding Father of Indian Medicine says -

As a physician I shall always use my knowledge for the welfare of mankind

I shall always be ready to serve patients, even if I am extremely busy and tired;

I shall not harm any patient for the sake of monetary or selfish gains;

Nor shall I entertain a desire for pleasure, greed or wealth;

Immorality shall not emerge even in my thoughts.

Ethics is a law, a pledge that we take and it should be built into the system by policy makers, Governments, and more importantly the leadership team of the institution.

Ethics needn't necessarily be written rules. It is an innate discriminatory power between the right and the wrong. We must have our own internal ethical standards, as an individual, as a society, as a country, and as a community.

The fundamental core of all medical practices is that it should be for the welfare of humankind.

I told them that we must deliver this project of building the medical school within a year to have it inaugurated before the next academic session. Good doctors are indispensable for the society. Spending on making good doctors is not an expenditure, but an investment.



A Completely Free Medical College – In the rural, by the rural, of the rural, for the rural

Anybody who deserves to become a doctor should not be denied the opportunity because he can't afford it.

Why would a rural child come and serve in the rural areas when he has to pay a debt of, let's say, \$100,000 at the end of his medical education? That's why we came up with a free model of medical education.

It is not about the poor or rich, but it is about those who want to serve or those who want to make money after their education.

Our largest yardstick is to check whether our students have service-mindedness.

Many of our experienced professors who have joined our medical college have done so, after leaving their lucrative jobs. They said that they were inspired by the idea of a completely free medical college, and it is here that they have found a platform that they wanted.





This medical college is open to the whole world. As a private medical college, we can offer a certain number of seats to foreigners and NRI too.

Many of our medical students are girls and this is an added advantage to the field of Mother and Child Health, as this is one of the areas that need attention.

In free rural hospitals, you get tremendous research opportunities and experience, due to the caseload and case mix.



How did we scale it up?

More and more people approached us for help. We couldn't say no to them. And one after the other, things started happening, and we were on a roll. Most importantly, we had an excellent team.

Professionalism coupled with commitment and enhanced with divine grace, is the secret recipe to our success.

God's grace and good people have supported us from around the world. So, we could never stop.

We have 2,000 people working in our organisation. All these people have joined us in the last ten years.

Everything that was done was divinely orchestrated and humanly executed.

Sow Service and Reap Gratitude

A girl, daughter of one of our cooks came and told me that she wants to become a doctor. She joined our school and later we gave her an opportunity to pursue medical education. Today, she is a doctor and is working in our hospital with a sense of gratitude and joy.

This idea of compassion inspired by that divinity is not different for you and me. You have to harness it; reach out and dig deeper. Once you are in touch with that, it will inspire you, your intuition will guide you, and that is the God within. With that inspiration, we are here and that is how we do what we are doing.

My intuition said that a free medical college has to come up because this is what God wanted. Then, who am I or you or anybody else to stop it? We had to do what we had to, and things started manifesting on its own.



Our Tale in Clarksdale

During the year 2015/16, when we went to Clarksdale, we learnt that the Southern Mississippi Delta region is relatively poor and many people of southern communities do not have access to healthcare, because they are uninsured or underinsured.

So, we started People Shores in the US, which provides training and employment to young people, especially for the marginalised section. After the training, they also get a job. Today, more than 250 youngsters are engaged across five centres.

We also started a free medical clinic at Clarksdale and no body believed that it could give free services without any agenda. It took two to three years to win the local community's trust, including the doctors. Now, everybody understands our intention and appreciates it.

We are planning to open a centre in every single State in the United States. We can train young people, make them job ready, help them find employment, and come out of the generational poverty cycle.





Happiness is Success

You have to define success yourself, and no definition is wrong. To me, success is simply about feeling happiness while doing what you are doing. When you are not satisfied, you are not successful.

Effortlessness and a sense of no burden is success. The most important thing is to find happiness in success, not pleasure or convenience or comfort.



Cancelling Cancers

The only solution to cancer is to go to the root cause. The food we consume these days is made from chemical farming which uses a lot of pesticides and insecticides.

We are starting a programme to improve agricultural practices in India, and going back to the old ways, growing it organic, training the new generation and helping them to build their business around agriculture.

Agriculture has to be made as glamorous as IT, so a child can proudly say that he is the son of a farmer, and he does farming in the right way.

We are also starting an Oncology Department in our hospital, along with like-minded organisations and this can lessen the burden as much as possible.

Lessons For Life

How to inspire children to connect to God?

It is much to do with your connection with God, as a parent. At His Feet, I Found My True Self

Dr Vimala Subramaniam is a Research Officer at the Forest Research Institute of Malaysia. She had specialised in Biotechnology and her research is based on Malaysian traditional herbal medicine, specific to antioxidants and preventive healthcare. Her husband, Mr Ayavoo Arumugam, is a retired architect from the Central Bank of Malaysia. He is currently building the Advaita Anand Ashram at Janda Baik. Her son, Sai Sudarshan has just completed medicine and pursuing internship. Swami has guided their son to specialise in cardiology. Dr Vimala, together with her husband established the Sai Ananda Centre in 2007. Subsequently, in the year 2017, they founded the Sai Ananda Foundation. Their entire life is a picture painted by Swami. Swami had once told them, "You are very lucky because I quide you and I tell you what to do. You don't have to think for yourself!"

was born to a simple, middle-class family in West Malaysia. My mother was a school teacher and my father a meteorological-weather-man, which housed us next to the airport, together with the air-force army, far away from the city. However, my parents believed in good education, and thus, we travelled many kilometres daily, by public transport, to go to school in the city.

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In the midst of such busy schedules, one late evening, as the setting sun painted the sky with red and orange hues, we heard a knock on the door of our small government quarters. A young well-built man, in army uniform, stood at the entrance with a broad smile, introducing himself as 'Mr Sai Ram.' Our family of six members had no idea of the term 'Sai Ram'. As my father did not recognise him, Mr Sai Ram explained that he was a new army officer, recently posted for duty. He started speaking about 'Sai Baba



of Puttaparthi' and handed over a book titled 'Man of Miracles' to my mother. My mother, astonished by the strange introduction, started to read the book. She felt a calling from within her heart and planned to visit Sai Baba in Puttaparthi. It was the year 1976, and my parents had no clue where Puttaparthi was, and Mr Sai Ram was nowhere to be found any time later. They approached a friend, and the three of them landed in Puttaparthi, after much difficulty and challenges. Upon arriving at Prasanthi Nilayam, they were offered simple accommodation and dinner, and were summoned for darshan the next morning.

For the first time, my parents laid their eyes on the beautiful, effulgent form of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, who was gliding over the sands of Prasanthi, adorned in an orange robe. Swami uttered the magical words, "Malaysians go......", inviting them into a small interview room, where he blessed them with materialised vibhuti and gave spiritual guidance. Upon their return, my mother announced to us, the young and elderly family members, "Sai Baba is God, we will follow Him!" My parents, together with other devotees, were instrumental in founding the initial Sai Baba Centre in North Malaysia.

I met Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in 1981 when I was 14 years old, during an interview with my family and some devotees. Swami spoke lovingly to all, and spoke to my grandmother in Tamil, since she could not understand English, and enquired, "Are you alright, Amma? I will take care!" This brought her tears of joy. Together with my family, we participated actively in all centre activities. My mother became an EHV teacher and Bal Vikas coordinator. My father chaired the centre for many years, and we served Swami with all our hearts.

In 1996, during an interview together with my husband, Swami spoke about Education in Human Values (EHV) and gave us blessings for conducting EHV class in Batu Caves, Kuala Lumpur. Little did we know that it would grow and expand to become Sai Ananda Foundation Malaysia, carrying the torch of Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai.

When Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba attained Maha Samadhi in 2011, we were not saddened, as we didn't look at it as an end. We were confident that our beloved Master would come back to continue His mission. Swami, in His many mystical ways, showed us signs of His return, further strengthening our conviction. We continued to pray fervently and waited eagerly for every Guru Purnima and Birthday Celebration, hoping to witness the great resurrection. None could come, even close, to the mega mystical master plan of the 'Sukshma Sai', leaving the devotees in awe and wonder.

In May 2014, Swami's first Satsang in Kodaikanal, in the Sukshma form, reached our ears. The same year, a devotee from Puttaparthi had dropped a precious gift for us (Swami's robe) at Dr Ravi Pillay's residence in Singapore, and we were invited to collect the robe and attend Swami's Satsang (in Sukshma form). We were thrilled with the invitation, as we were searching and



longing for Swami. I remember chanting the Sai Gayathri mantra for eight hours, the day prior to our departure, and all the way during the four-hour drive to Singapore. The next morning, with hearts pounding, we entered the majestic hall of Sai Anandam, Singapore, and I was seated on the third row from Swami's chair. For the first time, I witnessed the Sukshma phenomenon, and my skeptical mind immediately rejected the idea. I spoke to Swami in my heart, 'Swami, I am not interested in all these, we have your photo and we have your centre, and we will continue to serve you. That is enough.'

However, when Swami started to speak and deliver His discourse, I was wonder-struck, as I could feel the strong yet gentle energy of love emanating from Swami's chair, touching and piercing me, and tears profusely rolling down my cheeks. I was feeling embarrassed to be crying in public (for no real reason) but I could not stop the tears.

Yes! It was Swami, seated on that chair, unseen to my eyes, but surely felt by my heart. I could hear His words.... His message. I was totally convinced of His presence... somehow... somewhere....in some form or noform.... He was there!

When the Satsang was over, I looked up hopefully, but Sri Madhusudan Sai walked on without a glance. My heart shattered—I wanted to meet Swami, I wanted to speak to Swami. I ran to the hosting family, trying to introduce myself, but in vain. Politely, but firmly, we were ushered out for lunch. My mind froze. There was only one thing in my mind..... SWAMI! I must see SWAMI! And I started pleading to Swami in my heart, 'Swami! We are in Singapore, nobody knows us here, but You know us..... You know us, Swami! If it is really you, you will recognise us, you will call us. Otherwise, I shall leave, never to return.' And lo! The Lord of the Universe responded to my heart's call. The door opened, and Swami called the Malaysian family, for an interview. We ran in, not knowing what to expect..... the beautiful reunion with Sai Maa.

Swami said, "I am coming to your house. Now that you have seen the Satsang here in Singapore, go back and prepare in Malaysia, I will come soon".

At His Feet, I Found My True Self

Thus began a new era with Swami in the form of Sri Madhusudan Sai from 2015 to 2019. Swami was Love, Love, and nothing but LOVE! Swami started many new projects, such as the Free Haemodialysis Centre, which we would have never had the courage to embark on.

Swami said, "I had to pressurise your husband to start the dialysis centre. So many needy patients are waiting for treatment, only I know their anguish."

Swami said, "Form and register a foundation". Today stands Sai Ananda Foundation Malaysia (SAFM) with social beneficiary activities in Medicare, Educare, and Sociocare including a Dialysis Centre, health clinic, dental clinic, medical camps and home visits, kindergarten, tutorial centre, refugee education centre, daily feeding, sewing class, baking and skills training, monthly rations, monthly living allowances for elderly and student sponsorships.

Swami said, "You will see a ring of fire, do not be afraid, just close your eyes and jump, I will be there on the other side to catch you!"

Swami then gave us precise instructions for the construction of a new ashram at Janda Baik, a one-hour drive from Batu Caves, situated in a hilly forest reserve on the Titiwangsa Range of Peninsular Malaysia. Swami blessed the land twice and performed the Bhumi Pooja, when He materialised a black lingam and embedded it into the earth.

Swami named the ashram, 'Anand Ashram' (Hermitage of Bliss) and called it the Kodaikanal of Southeast Asia. It will serve as an Advaita Ashram (non-duality, with no form and name), and teach the highest truths of parāvidya.

The global pandemic and lockdown kept us away from Swami for the next two years, during which time the world received the most precious teachings of parāvidya. Starting with the series of Master the Mind, and followed by kathopanisad, the doors of the inner journey creaked open. I tried to practice meditation but initially found it difficult to sit still, even for 10 minutes. Gradually, I progressed and completed a 42-day meditation session. One morning, we had over-slept, and at sharp 6 am (our daily meditation time), there was a big loud bang in our bedroom, which startled us and made us jump out of bed. We were woken up, so as not to miss the morning meditation. There were various such experiences, such as beautiful celestial-like music that woke me up for meditation, whenever the alarm clock failed to do so.

In November 2021, just as the borders were beginning to open up, Swami invited us to the 96th Birthday Celebration in Muddenahalli. The Kuala Lumpur International Airport had just opened, but Malaysian Airlines was not flying. We could not find any flights to Bangalore, but when the Lord calls, who can deter us? Finally, taking a long and arduous route, Kuala Lumpur-Colombo-Maldives-Bangalore, we reached Muddenahalli. At the evening darshan, meeting Swami after a lapse of two years, He said, "Somehow you managed to land here!"

After the beautiful, heart-enticing birthday celebration, Swami called us for an interview the next day and showered the love of a thousand mothers.

Seated at His feet, Swami spoke to me directly, looking deep into my eyes, as if locking my eyes, and suddenly............... my mind popped out, and I could visualise my mind, as if outside of me, and it was furious and ugly, troubling and distracting. I was utterly shaken up and shocked. The experience continued for as long as Swami's eyes remained intently on me. For many following days, I was troubled by the experience, as I could not understand what actually happened. Only much later it dawned on me that I could now see my mind, as a separate entity, and I could go beyond. Oh! What a gift in my inner journey!

In 2022, our beloved Guru, Sadguru Sri Madhusudan Sai visited Malaysia and stayed in the new ashram. He told my husband to move and live permanently in the ashram. This left me in the city, fearful of living alone. In the following interview, I expressed my fear to Swami. He looked intently into my eyes, engaging in a conversation. Upon return, I found that my fear had disappeared to a great extent. During other interviews, Swami had sometimes chided me strongly, only to find that great attachments have left me and stumbling blocks have been crushed.

More than the Upanishads, more than meditation, more than self-effort, it is sitting at the feet of Sadguru, that has pushed me deeper and deeper into my inner journey.

The greatest power of transformation lies in His EYES. Among all, this would be my greatest story of inner transformation – at the feet of the Lord!

Finally, Swami told me to quit my job, sell the house and move to Anand Ashram. He said, "I am sending you to Vanaprastha. I will take care!" And my inner journey continues......
